


# Georgia FLHP

**The Federal Lands Highway Program in Georgia.** The Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge encompasses over 402,000 acres—the largest National Wildlife Refuge in the eastern United States—and remains one of the oldest and most well preserved freshwater areas in America. Swamp Island Drive is a 9-mile driving, bicycling, and walking loop that winds through the Refuge. Scattered throughout the drive are

walking trails, wildlife openings, and hardwood plots. Sites along the walking trails off Swamp Island Drive include a restored homestead originally built in the 1920s. A 3/4 mile boardwalk leads to a 50-foot observation tower. Eastern Federal Lands resurfaced Swamp Island Drive and resurfaced, reconstructed, and reconfigured the Refuge's East Entrance Parking Area.
