

Iowa. Herbert Hoover National Historic Site is located within the community of West Branch. Parkside Drive is the primary link between West Branch and Interstate 80. It provides access to the site, the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library-Museum, and the community. The National Park Service has primary responsibility for maintenance, and providing safe roads and walkways for the community and visitors to this area.



Areas of delamination and spalling have developed in the deck surface and the approach sidewalks and curbs have settled by up to four inches, creating a hazard for pedestrians and cyclists. Eastern Federal Lands will repair the Parkside Drive Bridge and the Second Street Bridge, and repair potholes, replace sidewalks and curbing,

and restripe markings on Parkside Drive. Two way traffic will be maintained at all times during construction to avoid inconvenience to the surrounding community, and to maintain access to the National Historic Site.
