


FEDERAL LANDS ACCESS PROGRAM

Nebraska

The Federal Lands Access Program is a program for states, counties, tribes and local governments. The program provides funds for transportation facilities that provide access to, or are located on or adjacent to Federal lands, with emphasis placed on facilities that access high use recreation sites or Federal economic generators. The Federal lands access transportation facility must be owned or maintained by the state, tribe or local government.



Eligible projects include engineering, rehabilitation, restoration, construction, reconstruction, transportation planning, and research of Federal lands access transportation facilities, and may include:

1. Adjacent vehicular parking areas;
2. Acquisition of necessary scenic easements and scenic historic sites;
3. Provisions for pedestrians and bicycles;
4. Environmental mitigation in or adjacent to Federal land to improve public safety and reduce vehicle-caused wildlife mortality while maintaining habitat connectivity;
5. Construction and reconstruction of roadside rest areas, including sanitary and water facilities; and
6. Operation and maintenance of transit facilities.
